ADVOCACY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

COMMITTEE CHARGE

The Advocacy Advisory Committee serves as a resource to the Government Relations program. Recommending positions on legislative issues and responding to regulatory concerns, as well as planning for proactive initiatives. The committee is comprised of architects representing various design disciplines and/or building types, and an attorney who actively represents architects in legal matters. The committee's recommendations are forwarded to the Executive Committee and the Board of Directors for action.

OVERARCHING GOALS/OUTCOMES FOR 2023

- 1. Advocate for policies related to climate change and the built environment.
- 2. Expand outreach efforts to improve organization's influence at the Capitol and regulatory bodies impacting our profession.
- 3. Support local components in their advocacy efforts.

STATUS SUMMARY / RECOMMENDATIONS

The Advocacy Advisory Committee will be meeting in March to review the bills introduced this year in the California State Legislature and make recommendations to the Board. We have introduced one bill, AB 342 (Valencia), which will allow the California Architect Board to request demographic information from licensees for the purpose of helping to advance our Equity, Diversity and Inclusion Efforts, and we are working with the Governor's Office and Budget Committee staff to address the issue surrounding Architects having to register with the Department of Industrial Relations for Public Works Projects. We are continuing to build relationships with Legislative staff, Legislators, regulatory staff, and allied organizations. We have code advocacy efforts in the works touching on CALGreen, International Existing Building Code, and decarbonization reach codes. In March, we will restart our Local Component Advocacy Network, which is a forum for reporting policy issues relevant to chapters, receiving news from AIA CA, helping to coordinate local advocacy initiatives, and providing feedback on how AIA CA can better serve chapters on advocacy issues.
