### ELIGIBILITY

- **Built** and **unbuilt** projects, **research**, and **publications**
- Built projects must have been completed as of Jan 1, 2019
- Must be a licensed architect or student
- Architects with a California license may submit built projects located anywhere in the world
- Architects licensed in other states may only submit built projects located in California
- Undergraduate, graduate and 2025 recent graduates are eligible to submit student work
- Must NOT include individual, firm name, company organization, or school name in final PDF

### SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Each completed submission package must follow these guidelines. Your entry will be disqualified if it does not contain the required elements.

- Full Project Portfolio
- Student ID for student submissions
- Project/Research photos and signed release

### GENERAL PORTFOLIO GUIDELINES

**Submitted in PDF format, 8.5x11 landscape orientation. No more than 8MB and 13 pages.**

**No firm name. Preferred file name: 2025\_DA\_Project Name**

- **Page 1:** Cover Page with Project/Research name and location or context (Do NOT include firm name, author name, institution, or organization anywhere in PDF)
- **Page 2:** Project Summary, May include images

### BUILT/UNBUILT

- **Page 3:** Readable site plan with North arrow clearly indicated
- **Page 4:** At least one floor plan, but no more than two
- **Page 5:** Project sections and/or elevations
- **Page 6:** At least one sustainable design strategies diagram and resiliency diagram with brief description (additional page may be used if needed)
- **Pages 7-13:** Project Photos/renderings
  - Clear, high resolution
  - Limit of four (4) photos per page
  - Include at least one contextual photo showing project within surrounding area
- **Do not reveal the firm name, architect of record, student name or school**

### RESEARCH/PUBLICATIONS

- **Page 3:** Research framework or methodology diagram
- **Page 4:** Key findings visualization or organizational structure
- **Page 5:** Process diagrams, timelines, or analytical frameworks
- **Page 6:** Impact assessment and sustainability/resilience implications with brief description
- **Pages 7-13:** Supporting materials:
  - Clear, high resolution images/graphics
  - Limit of four (4) images per page
  - Field photography, data visualizations, comparative studies, case documentation
  - Exerts from research/publication
  - For books: spreads showing layout, typography, and content samples
  - Any included graphics must clearly support research findings

### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- If you list the firm name or do not meet all the requirements, your project will be disqualified
- For Students - Student ID will be uploaded separately and should not be included with your project submission
- For Students - Group projects are maxed at 3 students, all students involved must be listed on the registration
