PROFESSIONAL BACKGROUND

Greg Wynn, AIA, NCARB is an architect with specialized practice in residential historic renovation and has been an educator at Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo for 25 years. He currently teaches at Cal Poly. Greg is on the NCARB Board of Directors, and has served as the chair of the NCARB Examination R+D Committee. He currently serves as the NCARB Licensing Advisor for Cal Poly as well as the faculty advisor for AIAS. Greg has served as a Subject Matter Expert to the California Architects Board. He is also on the AIA-California Board of Directors and is past-president of AIA-Central Coast.

PHILOSOPHY, GOALS & OBJECTIVES

My goal in serving as Regional Director for the AIA Central Coast and Santa Barbara Chapters is to strengthen the connection between our two architecture communities and ensure their interests are effectively represented at AIA California. Although our chapters are separated by approximately 90 miles, we share many common challenges, opportunities, and professional priorities. I see this geographic distance not as a limitation, but as an opportunity to create stronger regional collaboration. A primary objective of my service would be to encourage the chapters to share resources, programming, advocacy efforts, and educational opportunities whenever possible. Coordinating events, professional development, emerging professional initiatives, and legislative outreach to expand participation while reducing duplication of effort and strengthening the collective voice of architects throughout the region.
